From then on, 'THE 1530 **CLUB**' was formed in my road where we met daily at 15.30, all observing social distancing and each one enjoying own cup of tea or cold drink, catching up on daily updates with regards to the lockdown, the virus spread and all other things!! There were many main participants and there were those who joined for a quick chat, young and old, from our road and other roads around us. Luckily, we were blessed with lovely weather throughout April and May when it was so essential to keep morale up and not feel isolated during the lockdown period. This created a fabulous sense of community in our road, which has always been there, but was so much more evident during this period. The road is a dead end road and so this helps as we do not have through traffic.

Most residents have been here a long time including myself 37 years this December... '**THE 1530 CLUB'** is still going but not on a daily basis as in the previous months of lockdown and is very much appreciated by all.

As well as this I shopped for others in the road as necessary, whether weekly shopping or just top up shopping, but it all helped as the queues to get into supermarkets were truly long and there was always a long wait. Also some of those in the road who are not vulnerable also assisted with shopping and once again there was a great sense of community and long may this continue.

I also enjoyed taking my dog Coco for a walk, gardening, keeping in touch with family and friends, keeping up to date with news, cooking, baking, computer work, tapestry, housework, etc etc...!! and praying of course and it was lovely to finally see my family again.
