Crime Prevention Advice: Beware of Scams and Cold Calling

"There have been reports of scam calls from an individual claiming to be from British Gas. During the call, the individual attempts to extract a range of personal details by falsely claiming that a meter needs changing, for example. If you receive a similar call, please hang up and **do not** provide them with any of the information that they are asking for.

If you would like to get confirmation from your supplier of any changes to your account, seek out their telephone number from an old bill and wait at least 5 minutes to ensure the line has been cleared from the scam call. Fraudsters often try to pressure you into making a quick decision, so don't hesitate to take a step back and consider whether a call is genuine. Suspected scams or fraud should be reported to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040"
