Old Testament:

Jeremiah 29.1-14 Jeremiah's letter sent from Jerusalem to the exiles who have been forcibly deported and are now living in exile in Babylon New Testament :

1 Peter 1.1-2 and 2.9-17 Part of Peter's letter to Christians scattered through the provinces of the Roman Empire in what is now eastern Turkey. Peter uses the metaphor of exile in writing to them about their situation.

A Talk about Nelson Mandela – Tuesday 8th June, 7pm via Zoom.

An online talk from Rev Colin Chambers, who was chaplain to Nelson Mandela for eight years on Robben Island. Colin is now an Alabaré chaplain, helping to support veterans who have become homeless to rebuild their lives.

Colin will talk about Mandela, focussing particularly on forgiveness and reconciliation including an introduction to apartheid, and after his talk there will be an opportunity to ask questions through the Question and Answer facility.

The evening should provide fascinating insights into Nelson Mandela and life on Robben Island.
