#### ***Wren and Beyond***

When the famous architect Sir Christopher Wren visited Salisbury in 1668 at the invitation of his friend Bishop Seth Ward he wrote the first known report on the condition of the Cathedral fabric. In the centuries following Wren's visit the repair and restoration of the Cathedral has been a constant challenge.

To commemorate the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Wren's death in 1723 join Cathedral Archivist Emily Naish, and Clerk of Works Gary Price, to find out more about Wren's visit, his report preserved in the Cathedral's archive, and the ongoing repair work today.

### **Hall Access**

If you hold a key to the Parish Hall or Meeting Room, please note that you may only use them at the times you are contracted to do so. Should you need to access the hall outside of these times can you please call Linda Baker, to check if this is ok and so she can enter it in the diary.
