## Test run of Emergency Alert System – Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2023.


A new Emergency Alert System has been created to warn the public if there is a nearby danger to life. A test run of this service has now been scheduled for Sunday, 23 April 2023.


Emergency Alerts are messages sent to all compatible 4G and 5G mobile phones when there's a danger to your life, health, or property in the area you're located. For example: flooding, fire, or extreme weather. The service doesn't require your location or phone number and only the government and the emergency services can send the alerts. If you don't have a mobile, you'll still be kept informed through other channels. If you get an Emergency Alert on your phone, you'll hear a loud, siren-like sound. A message on your screen will tell you about the emergency and how best to respond. (Please note you will still hear the siren even if your phone is on silent).
