The Church Electoral Roll is revised this year. This means that if you are on the 2022 Roll you will automatically be included in 2023. There is no need for any action on your part. Those who have joined our congregations since last May are warmly invited to fill in one of the application forms which are available from the Electoral Roll Officer at the address below.

To be eligible for membership of the Roll, you should be over 16 years of age on 21st May 2022 (the date of the APCM), have been baptised and live in the Parish or, if you do not live in the Parish, have been worshipping here regularly for the last six months.

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting is officially divided into 2 meetings - one for election of Churchwardens which can be attended by both those on the Church Electoral roll and those whose names are entered on a register of local government electors by reason of such residence, which is followed by the annual church meeting which can be attended by all but only those on the Church Electoral roll can vote.
