# Can you help?

We have been asked by Paul Butler, if we can assist a family of Ukrainian refugees, mother, father and four children, who have been hosted voluntarily until now, but their host cannot accommodate them beyond August. They are looking for rented accommodation. The father works, but does not earn enough to pay current market rate for a three or four bedroomed house, which is around £1200-£1300 per month.Paul knows of them through the Hub at Salisbury Methodist Church, who have so far been unable to find them a suitable let. Does anyone know of anywhere up for rent in this area, please?An alternative might be a source of assistance with other expenses e.g children's activities. Any suggestions welcome.
